President's Message


Greetings!

Many of us were very social people before the pandemic, but now the prospect of meeting others in person can be stressful. This is a normal reaction because we have been told for several months to stay at home and avoid others. For those of us who have become accustomed to limited contact, with no touching or hugs, or face-to-face meetings, this may be a challenging transition. Our outdoor gatherings have been met with joy. There is no substitute for in-person meetings and many of us look forward to returning to them.

I propose we move forward with appropriate caution, one step at a time. According to Government of Ontario guidelines, our numbers are restricted to those we can fit in with social distancing. We are expected to wear masks indoors, and keep the environment sanitized. Services will still be available on Zoom for those that cannot participate indoors.

But many of us will be together, at last, in person. I am hoping that gradually we will regain our sense of normalcy. So, I am very happy that we had an outdoor service in Mary-lyn's back yard on Sept. 12. I'm looking forward to our first service in a year and a half at our UCN building on Church Street on Sunday, September 19, where we will examine what Covid has taught us about community and connections.

UCN Hybrid Services

The UCN will be returning to in-person services this fall, on September 19. Of course all the required Covid protocols will be followed.

The setup for services will be a bit different, however. We will be using a hybrid service model, where you can join us either in person or on Zoom.

We will have a camera and a computer set up at the UCN, and will run a Zoom meeting from there. We'll use the existing projector and screen to show the Zoom attendees to the people at the UCN, and sound from the Zoom attendees will issue from the speakers at the UCN. A video camera will be used to show the proceedings in the building to participants on Zoom, and they will also receive sound from the in-person meeting. This means that Zoom participants will be able to participate in discussions, Joys and Concerns, etc. That's the main difference between a hybrid service and the streaming services that many churches use, where online viewers can see and hear the service but can't participate.

We encourage you to attend in person, if possible, to have the full UCN experience, hopefully including coffee hour. However, if you are out of town, ill, are as yet unvaccinated, have been in contact with someone with Covid, or are just being cautious about in-person contacts, please join us on Zoom.

I'm looking forward to seeing all of you, whether in person or via Zoom.
